afterwards for those who wish to stay.

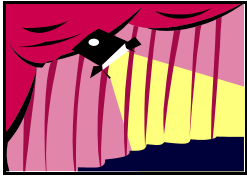
The Seminar will be held at the Courthouse, second floor (Main Street.)

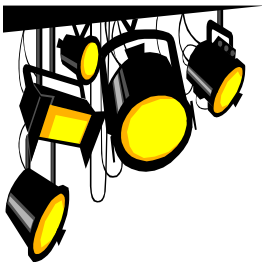

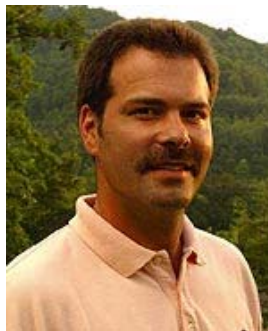

Richie Farmer to be Keynote Speaker at Carroll County Community Development Corporation Annual Shareholders Meeting

RICHIE FARMER, Kentucky's newly-elected Agriculture Secretary, will be the keynote speaker at the annual meeting of the Carroll County Community Development Corporation, to be held on Tuesday, January 20, 2004, at 12:00 noon at the General Butler State Resort Park Conference Center in Carrollton. Discussing the status of agriculture in the Commonwealth, Farmer will detail how his administration will deal with the adversities facing the agricultural economy, and what alternative programs he will initiate to replace tobacco as Kentucky's premier cash crop.



A native of Clay County, Farmer is a graduate of the University of Kentucky with a double major in Agricultural Economics and Agribusiness Management. He is best known for his role as a four year UK's basketball team member. "A Farmer All Of His Life" as his campaign slogan noted, Farmer most recently worked as an investment advisor. Active in the Clay County community, the father of three has given his time to many charitable organizations including the Boys and Girls Clubs, Big Brothers-Big Sisters, Children's Miracle Network, the American Cancer Society and "Kicks for Kids".

The Carroll County Community Development Corporation was formed in 1982 to address issues in the community utilizing volunteers from every facet of the county including local government, lending institutions, industrial partners, commercial ventures and individuals and community groups. Throughout the years, the CCCDC has been involved in recruiting and retaining industry and commercial entities, improving infrastructure with water and sewer lines, establishing two historic districts, and operating programs for the betterment of the community, including the MOMS initiative. Each year the Corporation elects directors to its eleven member board. Stockholders are entitled to vote on the directors. A business meeting, complete with the election of officers, is scheduled for 12:30 p.m., following Farmer's presentation. Farmer's speech and the CCCDC's meeting is open to the public. A buffet lunch will be served. The cost of the meal will be \$10.00 per person. Reservations are requested to assure adequate seating by calling 732-7034 no later than Friday, January 16, 2004. 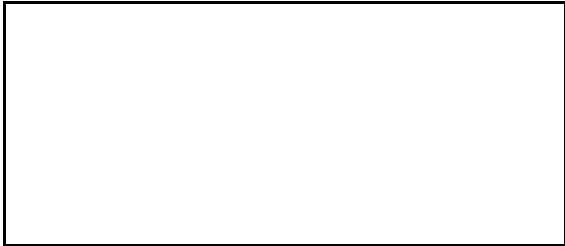

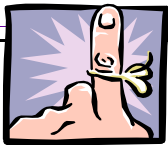
