

Point Park measures 15 acres and includes a boat dock, playground, camping & picnic area. Carroll County Horse Park, where you can participate or be a spectator. Monthly shows occur during fair weather. Robert Westrick Memorial Park, offers tennis courts, fitness trail, basketball, swimming pool, baseball fields and much more. Carrollton is also the home of the Kentucky Veterans Memorial.

Carroll County has several educational opportunities to offer, public schools starting with Pre-school through 12th grade. The Christian Academy is also an option as they offer Christ centered education.
